## PUPIL PREMIUM GRANT REPORT 2014 – 2015

### Context

Pupils for Wilberforce Primary come from a range of backgrounds and circumstances. 84% come from the most deprived IDACI band and 67% are eligible for the pupil premium grant. 88% have EAL with 29 different languages spoken and there are 30 different ethnic groups represented at the school. Many families find themselves in challenging circumstances. Pupil Premium funding is used to raise standards at Wilberforce Primary and close the gap on National.

### Summary of PPG spending 2014 – 2015

#### Objectives of spending PPG:

- To raise attainment of pupils with free school meals and those looked after.
- To ensure those pupils with free school meals and those looked after make rapid progress to close the gap between what they achieve and what those nationally achieve.
