**SAFER INTERNET DAY 2015**  
10<sup>th</sup> FEBRUARY *Let's create a better internet together*

To celebrate Safer Internet Day on Tuesday 10<sup>th</sup> February 2015, we will be holding a drop-in E-safety awareness session on how to keep your child safe online. Come and join us from 3:15pm in the Main School Hall.

We can only be successful in keeping children safe online if we work with you to ensure the E-Safety message is consistent. Your help is needed to talk to your children about how they can keep safe and behave appropriately online.

Use these conversation starters to find out what your child does online.

**Top tip: keep devices that connect to the internet in family spaces rather than bedrooms.**

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Ask your child if they know where to go for help, where to find the safety advice, privacy settings and how to report or block on the services they use.

Think about how you each use the internet. What more could you do to use the internet together? Are these activities you could enjoy as a family?

Ask them to tell you how they stay safe online. What tips do you have for you, to deal with online issues, and where did they learn them?

Encourage your child to do good digital deeds to help others. Perhaps they can show you how to do something better online or they might have a friend who would benefit from their help and support.

What could you do to make the internet a better place? Do you have creative skills, or ideas, to design a greater new website or app?

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Ask your child to tell you what they like the most about the internet and why e.g. sites they visit, ways to communicate, games they play etc.
