Whilst off-site the health, safety and welfare of all pupils remains paramount and schools follow the guidance in United Learning's Health and Safety policy when drawing up and implementing their policy and procedures for educational visits and activities off-site.

United Learning seeks to make reasonable adjustments to ensure those pupils with SEN, LDD or medical needs are not prevented from participation in educational trips. Any specific arrangements or provision that is put in place to ensure a pupil's well-being is explained to them before the visit to reassure and inform them.

United Learning schools are committed to ensuring that the application of this policy is non-discriminatory in line with the UK Equality Act (2010). This document is reviewed annually or as events or legislation requires.
