

**Wilberforce Primary School Sport Premium ACTION PLAN
2016/17**



This academic year the allocation of funding will be roughly £5457.

Purpose of the funding

The government is providing additional funding to schools to improve provision of PE and sport. Funding will be given for two academic years, September 2013 to August 2015, and can only be spent on PE and sports provision. Schools can choose how they use the funding, for example to:

- hire specialist PE teachers or qualified sports coaches to work with primary teachers during PE lessons
- support and involve the least active children by running after-school sports clubs and holiday clubs
- provide resources and training courses in PE and sport for teachers
- run sport competitions or increase pupils' participation in the School Games
- run sports activities with other schools
